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A. Purpose of This Sample

This document is an anonymized rendering of an Encore Readiness Receipt as it would be issued at the conclusion of a Standard EFAIRA engagement. The contractor name, system name, federal customer, and identifying details have been replaced with neutral placeholders. All other structural elements match a production receipt.

Federal contractors evaluating an EFAIRA engagement may use this sample to understand what they will receive at the end of the engagement and how to cite the receipt in a federal proposal volume. Federal program offices may use the sample to understand how a contractor-submitted receipt reads and what it does and does not represent.

OVERALL READINESS SCORE

Readiness score derived from 30 evaluation points across 8 domains, weighted under EFAIRA v1.0. SCOPE OF EVALUATION

The evaluation covered the AI-enabled software offering identified above, at the specific version noted, deployed in the test environment provided by the contractor. The evaluation did not cover future versions, integrations not in scope at the time of evaluation, or third-party services outside the system boundary as documented in the architecture package.

The federal contracting officer or technical evaluator receiving the cited proposal may verify the receipt through the public verification path at encoresvcsl1c.com/verify. The verification page confirms that the receipt was issued by Encore Services LLC, the date of issue, the system and version evaluated, the overall score, and the methodology version. The verification page does not disclose the underlying evidence package or any contractor-confidential information collected during the engagement.

What an agency may rely on. Encore stands behind the methodology, the issued score, the scope of evaluation, and the hash verification path. The receipt is an independent third-party signal that the agency may consider alongside its own evaluation under the source selection process governing the procurement.
